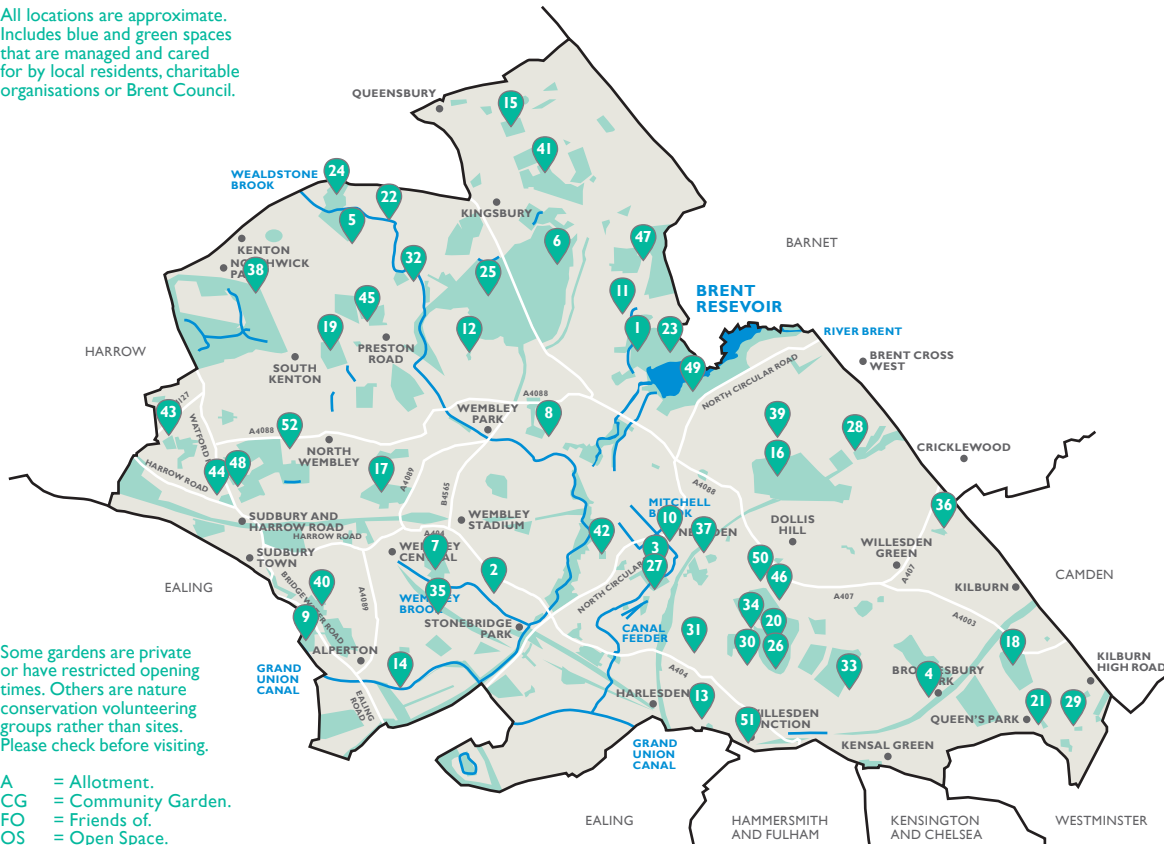


Brent's Hidden Gems
